<u>RE: ENVIRONMENTAL BASIC ASSESSMENT FOR PROPOSED 'DIEPWALLE FOREST</u> <u>TENTED CAMP' ON REMAINDER FARM 218 DIEPWALL, GARDEN ROUTE NATIONAL PARK,</u> <u>KNYSNA</u>

Cape EAPrac has been appointed by the Applicant, **South African Experiences Trading (Pty) Ltd.**, as independent environmental consultants to facilitate the environmental investigation and formal Basic Assessment process, in terms of the National Environmental Management Act (NEMA, Act 107 of 1998, as amended), for the proposed seasonal tented camp within the Diepwalle Forest of the Garden Route National Park, near Knysna.

The proposed approx. 1.5ha camp site is to be developed in an **existing clearing** and immediate forest fringe, previously created / used as a sawmill & timber industry site, and later as a film set and elephant boma during the filming of two movies based on the well-known forest novels by South African author Dalene Matthee, namely "Fiela se Kind" (1988) and "Toorbos" (1993). An existing pond / water feature adjacent to the site was previously created for the elephants. This site is located within the Farm Remainder 218 Deepwall, a large (4129.85 ha) property which forms part of the Garden Route National Park.




Figure 1: Study area within broader landscape, indicating location of RE/218 & site (Google Earth 2022, as edited by De Kock, 2023).

The site is accessed via a 1.6km **existing private forest track** (historic Ysterhoutrug Road) off the R339 gravel Provincial Road, which provides access to the existing Diepwalle Forest Station / Offices managed by South African National Parks (SANParks) and Uniondale beyond.

The proposed tented camp is to be a temporal, luxury retreat, to be operated during the summer months (Nov.- April.). During the winter months all moveable infrastructure will be removed from site. The camp is to consist of:

Fixed infrastructure restricted to raised wooden decks:

- 15 guest-tent platforms in gaps between trees, to support dome tents;
- Communal / dining deck partially under stretch tent, with communal toilet, pool & hot-tubs;
- Yoga deck;
- Raised wooden boardwalks linking decks / raised platforms;
- Platforms for 2 x 10 000lt rainwater tanks (2.5m x 2.5m each); and

Temporary / mobile infrastructure to be placed on ground:

- 3 x canvas staff tents, and 2 x staff toilets (male & female);
- 3 x kitchen & storage tents;
- 2 x 'zen' / quiet gaps & 1 x forest library;
- Solar generator on mobile trailer.

Services will be as follows:

- Power: Heating of water & pre-prepared food on gas, while lights by solar generator (panels, invertor & batteries on movable trailer).
- Water: Rainwater storage tanks to be filled by water tanker and/or gravity pipeline from Diepwalle Forest Station / Camp reservoirs through Forest. To be assisted by pressure pump.
- Sewerage: Chemical toilets (sealed units) to be emptied by service provider to Knysna WWTW.
- Greywater: Water from sinks, basins, pool & hot-tubs to be disposed of via soak-aways existing slip-paths through the Forest. Sink & basins to be fitted with fat screens to remove all fat, grease & oils. Only biodegradable soaps / detergents permitted.

The existing Diepwalle Forest Station will serve as a basecamp for camp operations – guests will leave their vehicles in the existing parking area & will be shuttled to & from the tented camp site.

All bulk storage, food preparation & waste disposal will take place in partnership with the Diepwalle Community Kitchen / Tea Garden.




Figure 3: Conceptual camp layout indicating proposed infrastructure.

No land-use application is applicable as development is considered to be a tourism-based land use associated with the National Park.

Deviations/Exemptions: None applied for.

You are required to indicate your preferred method of communication as part of your registration/submission. Correspondence throughout the remainder of the environmental process will only be distributed to <u>registered I&APs</u>.
