Youth care centre gets facelift

TEBOHO SETENA

The refurbishment of the Tshireletong Child and Youth Care Centre in Bloemfontein to meet an acceptable standard has cost the Free State government more than R55 million. This comes after the provincial Department of Labour closed the centre in 2017.

Dipolelo Mance, provincial MEC for Public Works and Infrastructure, officially handed over to the Department of Social Development this state property on Wednesday, 12 March.

The handover followed the completion of phase 2, with the centre now owning a recreational facility with elements such as a swimming pool and multi-purpose courts for tennis, netball, and basketball. New additions by the contractor, Mosa Consultants, include a guardhouse and solar panels for power-saving systems.

The major revamp of the centre amounted to R45 298 936 while its first phase was about R20,143 million.

In addition was the rental cost of R20 million for a lease agreements at two venues in Bloemfontein, the Christian Revival Church (CRC) and the Sentraal High School.

The rentals were for children moved following a prohibition order by the Labour Department. Phase 2 was conducted over a period of 14 months.

The section will be home to 140 staff members, including social workers serving the Bloemfontein region.

Mance has re-emphasised the importance of infrastructure maintenance.

"I know the importance of this facility in safeguarding vulnerable children and providing care.

"It must remain a home for them, and must be looked after very well by the commu-

The University of the Free State's (UFS) men's rugby side, the Shimlas, are striving to keep their chances of securing a necessary semifinal slot alive in defence of their Varsity Cup title.

The team earned a hard-fought 16 - 9 victory over hometown rivals, the Ixias of the Central University of Technology (CUT), Free State, in a Bloemfontein derby played last Monday, 17 March.

Though not the prettiest of wins for the defending champions, every point is worth its weight in gold. This was the lowest scoring fixture in the competition. Winger Kirwin du Preez scored the only try in the derby and propelled his team to fourth position on the log table. Ixias descended further to bottom, to occupy seventh position with six points. The Kovie lads have 16 points in the bag, equal as Ikeys of the University of Cape Town.

Both Ixias and Shimlas are pressured to pull out all the stops in their two remaining matches to finish on a high in this year's edition of the tournament. The UFS men are bound to show their pedigree

by qualifying for the semi-final which is a step closer to defending the prestigious crown. The Shimlas' must-win matches are against the Ikeys and the Tuks of the University of Pretoria (UP). The non-Free State sides are also eyeing to secure a semifinal slots. Tuks are in second place with 21 points behind the undefeated Maties of Stellenbosch, topping the table with 25 points.

The Ixias are compelled to avoid a must-win case between relegation or promotion, as was the case the last two years. The Bloemfontein boys can bolster their chances by winning the matches against the lackluster

Wits on Monday, 24 March, in a fixture to be played in the City of Roses. Kickoff is at 19:00. The last outing against the Eagles of North-West University (NWU) is on 31 March and will be played away. The Eagles, currently in fifth position with 11 points, will be tough to beat given they too are fighting to qualify for the semifinal. Both the Shimlas and Ixias are bound to sharpen their attacking line since they squandered scoring opportunities in the derby. They are compelled to show great determination to collect maximum points to remain in the tournament.

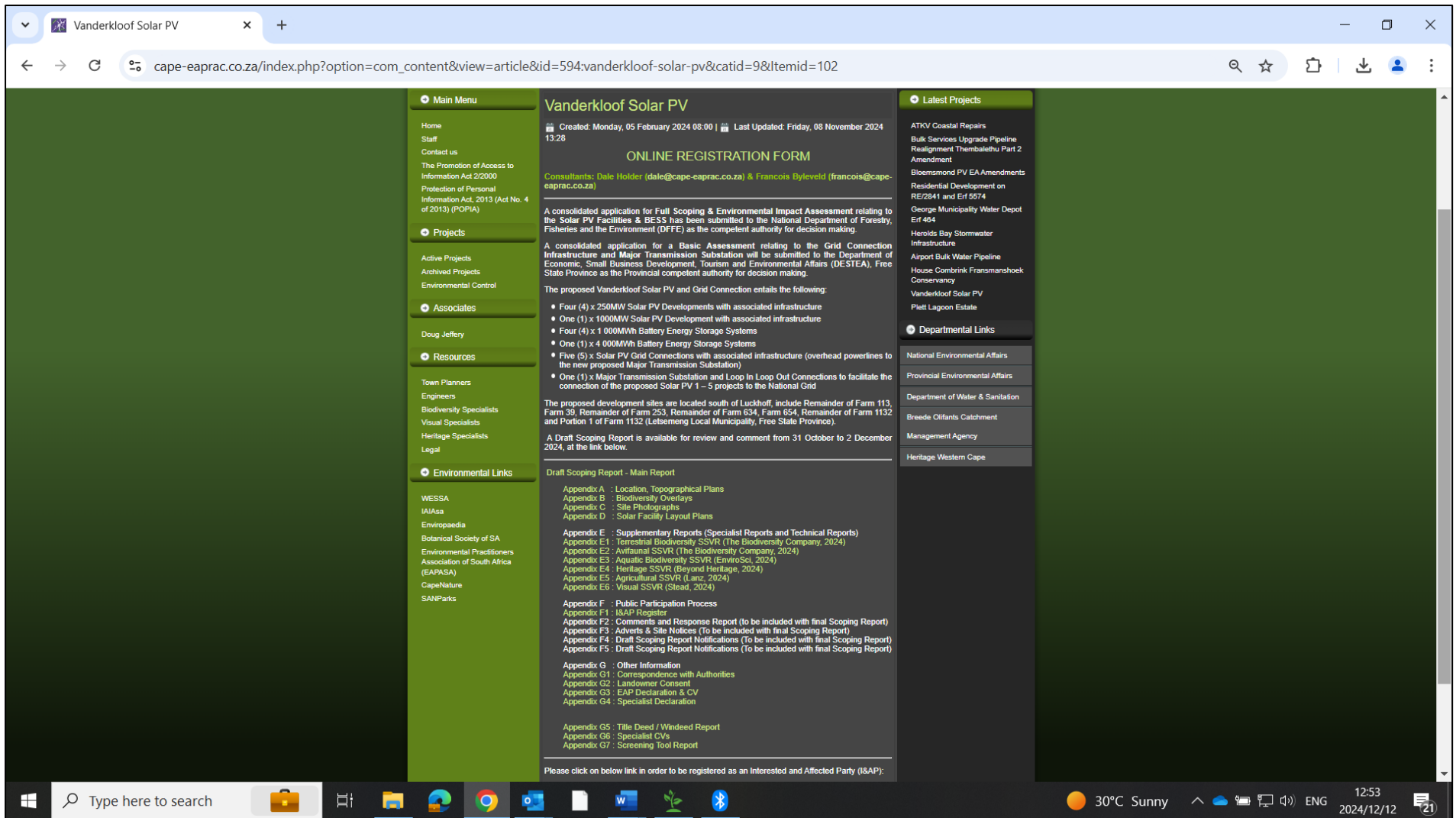


Figure 3: Draft Scoping Report as Available on the Cape EAPrac Website.

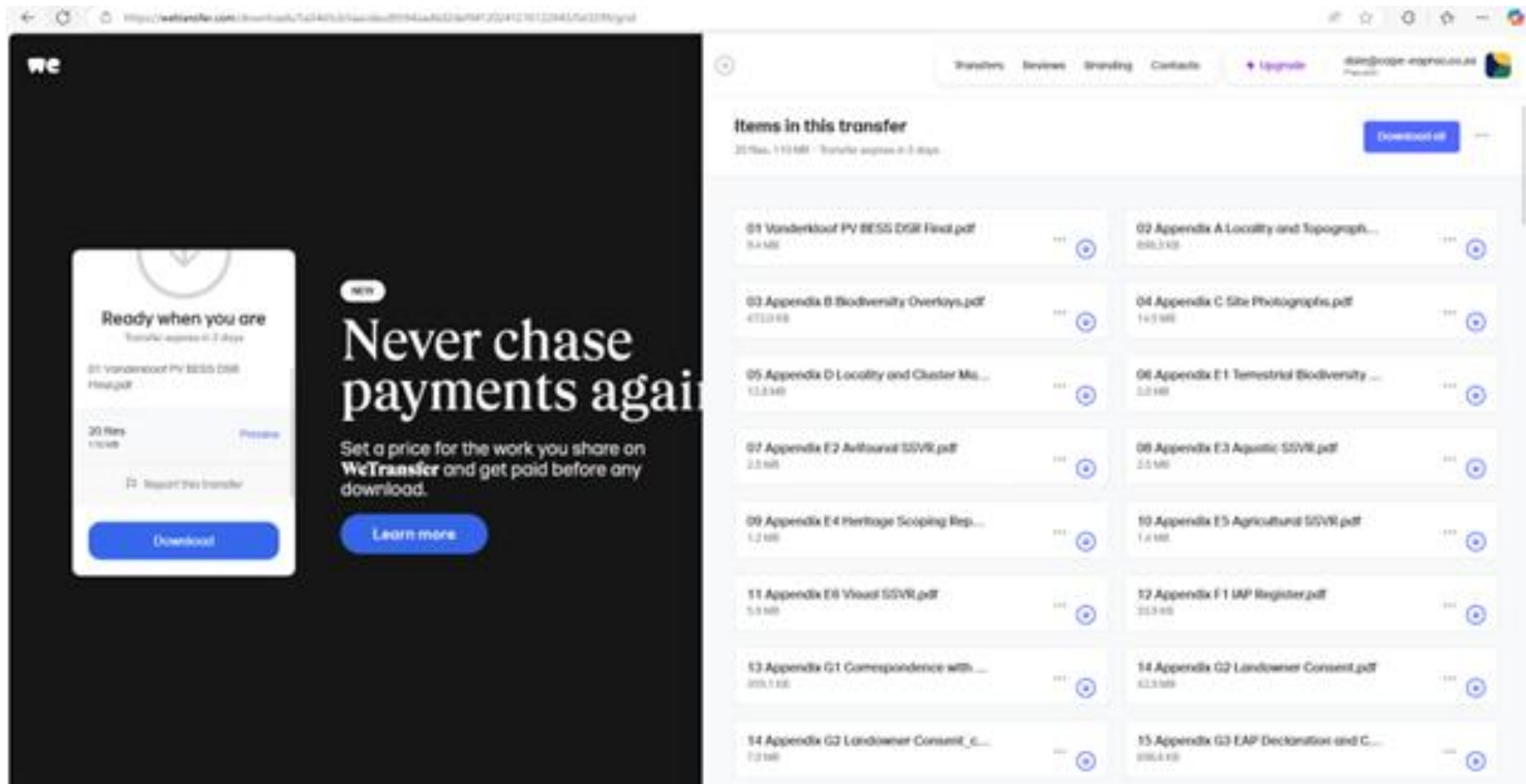


Figure 5: Draft Scoping Report as available via WeTransfer direct download.

Mangaung Metro het begin met die opgradering om voorafbetaalde watermeters se koepon-identifiseerder (KID) na 'n nuwe stelsel om te skakel. Hierdie opgraderings sal plaasvind tot en met die afsnydatum van **Sondag 24 November 2024**. Die projek sal in verskillende areas van die munisipaliteit plaasvind, en dit is daarop gemik om inwoners van Mangaung aan te moedig om die koopstelsel op hul huidige voorafbetaalde watermeters om te skakel.

Sodra die area geskeduleer is, word die nuwe stelsel bekendgestel en 'n sleutelveranderende opdateringskode gegenereer en die kliënt sal die kodes kan intik en na die nuwe stelsel omskakel. Meer as 16 000 meters sal voor die sperdatum omskakel word en versuim om na die nuwe stelsel om te skakel, sal daartoe lei dat inwoners nie hul meters kan herlaai nie en hulle sal sonder watertoevoer wees.
